Helmet Laws in California



- Section 21204 of the Vehicle Code will now require that all bicycle riders must ride upon a permanent seat (in other words, no "doubling up", riding on handle bars, etc.)
- Section 21212 was added to the Vehicle Code and will require that all youths under the age of 18 must wear a properly fitted and fastened bicycle helmet that meets ANSI or Snell standards when riding on any public street, bicycle path, or trail. Bicycle passengers in a child seat attached to the bicycle or in a trailer towed by the bicycle must also wear helmets.
- Effective January I, 1996, violators will be cited and fined \$25 unless the person charged alleges in court, under oath, that this is the first charge against them for failure to wear a helmet.
- The parent or legal guardian of a minor violator shall be jointly and severally liable with the minor for the fine.
- A portion of the monies collected from fines will be distributed to the county health department of the county in which the violation occurred to be used for bicycle safety education and to assist low-income families obtain helmets; a portion of the fines will be returned to the City in which the violation occurred
- Effective January 1, 2003 the California Bicycle Helmet Law for youth under the age of 18 has been extended to include:
 - ⇒ Scooters
 - ⇒ Skateboards
 - ⇒ In-line Skates

Helmet Fitting Guidelines

Check it out!



- ✓ The helmet should fit comfortably and securely.
- Do not buy a helmet your child will "grow into". (It should not be too large to block your vision or too small)
- ✓ It should be worn so that it is level on the head (not tilted back on the crown or pulled low over the forehead).
- ✓ You should not be able to move the helmet in any direction, back-to-front or side-to-side.
- ✓ The chin strap should be securely fastened.
- ✓ If needed, the helmet's sizing pads can help improve the fit.
- Get a new helmet if you have an accident the helmet may have been damaged and may not protect you a second time
